

## **Show Rules**

Judges: Mrs. Helen Newbold and Mrs. Elizabeth Davis

This Championship is aimed at keen and competitive amateurs, **not professionals.**

Stallions must be **handled and ridden** by people who have attained their 14<sup>th</sup> birthday on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2011.

Stallions and Colts must always be shown bitted

Horses and Ponies who have qualified for or competed at HOYS (except SEIB Search for a Star) in the years 2009, 2010, or 2011 are not eligible for the C&T Rider Championships.

Passports must be available for inspection if asked for by a judge or official of the show

Qualification for the 2011 Chiltern Equine Clinic CTR Championship can pass down the line – as far as 4<sup>th</sup> place

There must be **five or more** competitors in the class for qualification to pass down below 2<sup>nd</sup> place.

Rosettes to 5<sup>th</sup> place in all classes,

All lead rein entries will receive a rosette

### Working Hunter Classes

#### Showing Ring 1

Entry fee: £10 per class

Class 1: Cradle Stakes	Open to mares or geldings four years and over. Ponies not exceeding 122cm. Riders not to have reached their tenth birthday by 1 <sup>st</sup> January 2011. Jumps not to exceed 1'6".
Class 2: Nursery Stakes	Open to mares or geldings four years and over. Ponies not exceeding 133cm. Riders not to have reached their twelfth birthday by 1 <sup>st</sup> January 2011. Jumps not exceeding 1'9".
Class 3: Working Hunter Pony (122-133cm).	Open to mares or geldings four years and over. Pony must exceed 122cm but not exceed 133cm. Riders must not have reached their fourteenth birthday on 1 <sup>st</sup> January 2011. Jumps not to exceed 2'3".
Class 4: Working Hunter Pony (133-143cm)	Open to mares or geldings four years and over. Ponies must exceed 133cm but not exceeding 143cm. Riders must not have reached their seventeenth birthday by 1 <sup>st</sup> January 2011. Jumps not exceeding 2'6".
Class 5: Working Hunter Pony (143-153cm)	Open to mares or geldings four years and over. Ponies must exceed 143cm but must not exceed 153cm. Riders must not have reached their twentieth birthday by 1 <sup>st</sup> January 2011. Jumps not exceeding 2'9".
Class 6: Working M & M (<122cm)	Open to mares or geldings four years and over. All M & M ponies not exceeding 122cm. May be pure or part bred. Jumps not exceeding 1'9"
Class 7: Working M & M (122-138cm)	Open to mares or geldings four years and over. All M & M ponies exceeding 122cm but not exceeding 138cm. May be pure or part bred. Jumps not exceeding 2'3"
Class 8: Working M & M (>138cm).	Open to mares or geldings four years and over. All M & M ponies exceeding 138cm. Pure or Part bred. Jumps not exceeding 2'6".

#### Showing Ring 2

Entry fee: £8 per class

Class 9: Best Turned Out	Horses and ponies of all heights and ages can be on lead rein or not any suitable bit.
Class 10: Leading Rein	Ponies not exceeding 122cm (12hh) open to mares and geldings four years and over. Children must not have reached their ninth birthday by 1 <sup>st</sup> January 2011
Class 11: First Ridden	Open to ponies not exceeding 128cm (12.2hh) open to mares and geldings four years and over. Children must not have reached their eleventh birthday 1 <sup>st</sup> January 2011
Class 12: Ridden Veteran	For horses and ponies aged 15 years plus (born in or before 1996) open to stallions, mares and geldings, NO LEAD REINS
Class 13: In Hand Veteran	For horses and ponies aged 15 years plus (born in or before 1996) open to stallions, mares and geldings,
Class 14: Best Child Handler	Mares and geldings only. Section A: Children younger than 10 years on 1 <sup>st</sup> January 2011 Section B: Children under 14 on 1 <sup>st</sup> January 2011 but not younger than 10 years
Class 15: M & M Small Breeds in Hand	Open to mares, geldings and Stallions. Stallions and colts must be shown bitted. Open to Welsh section A and B, Exmoor, Dartmoor, Shetlands and miniature Shetlands.
Class 17: M & M Large Breed in Hand	Open to mares, geldings and Stallions. Stallions and colts must be shown bitted. Open to Welsh section C and D, Highland, Fell, Dales, Connemara and New Forest.
Class 18: M & M Small breeds Ridden	Open to Welsh section A and B, Exmoor, Dartmoor, Shetlands and miniature Shetlands. Lead reins welcome however will not qualify for Chiltern Equine Clinic CTR Championship
Class 19: Ridden M & M's Unregistered and Part Breeds	Open to any part bred or unregistered horse or pony
B&F Showing Championship	1 <sup>st</sup> & 2 <sup>nd</sup> place qualify from Classes 9-19 this will take place straight after class 19

#### SHOWING CLASSES

##### ROYAL INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW QUALIFYING CLASSES:

All hunter classes will be judged under the Sport horse of Great Britain Rules. Classes 23-26 & are qualifiers for the 2012 RIHS and only horses registered on the Show Hunter Register are eligible to enter. Registration numbers must be quoted on the entry form and owners and riders must be members of the Society. The two highest placed horses in each class will qualify to enter at the RIHS. No horse lower than second will qualify. In the *Working Hunter Class* the three highest placed horses will qualify unless they have already done so. No horse lower than third will qualify.

##### THE NATIONAL HUNTER SUPREME CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW QUALIFYING CLASSES:

All Hunter Classes will be judged under the Society's Rules. Classes 23-25 are qualifying events for this year's NHSCS, to be held at Addington Manor in September 2011. Only horses registered on the current year's Show hunter Register are eligible to enter. Registration numbers must be quoted on the entry form and owners and riders must be members of the Society. The three highest placed horses in the Lightweight, Middleweight, Heavyweight and Small Hunter Classes will qualify to enter at the NHSCS. No horse lower than third will qualify.

##### Class 23

LIGHTWEIGHT HUNTER - Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, capable of carrying up to 79.5kg (12 stone 7lbs). Judge will ride.

Entry Fee: £22 (includes £8 RIHS levy) Prizes: £50, £35, £25, £15

##### Class 24

MIDDLEWEIGHT HUNTER - Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, capable of carrying 79.5kg (12 stone 7lbs) and not exceeding 89 kg (14 stone). Judge will ride.

Entry Fee: £22 (includes £8 RIHS levy) Prizes: £50, £35, £25, £15

##### Class 25

HEAVYWEIGHT HUNTER -Mare or gelding,4 years old or over, capable of carrying over 89kg(14 stone). Judge will ride.

Entry Fee: £22 (includes £8 RIHS levy) Prizes: £50, £35, £25, £15

##### Class 26

SMALL HUNTER – Mare or gelding 4 years old or over exceeding 148cm (14.2hh approx) but not exceeding 158cm (15.2hh aprox) Judge will ride

Entry Fee: £22 (includes £8 RIHS levy) Prizes: £50, £35, £25, £15

CHAMPIONSHIP TO TAKE PLACE IN THE RING IMMEDIATELY AFTER CLASS 26 HAS FINISHED.

1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> PRIZE WINNERS IN CLASSES 23 - 26 (Champion £50 Reserve £25)

##### Class 27

AMATEUR RIDDEN HUNTER - For any weight horse. Judge will ride  
Entry Fee: £22 Prizes: £50, £35, £25, £15

##### Class 28

AMATEUR WORKING HUNTER – incorporating Best Local Entry (for competitors residing within the Bicester and Whaddon Chase Hunt country). The class will be run under the SHB GB 2011 rules and judges the same as the Working Hunter Classes but fences will not exceed 3'6" (1.07 m). Horses will have to be on the SHB(GB) basic id register.

##### Class 29

R.I.H.S OPEN WORKING HUNTER – A mare or gelding four years old and over exceeding 148cm (14.2 h). Fences will not exceed a maximum height of 1.14m (3'9")

Entry Fee: £22 (includes £8 RIHS levy) Prizes: £50, £35, £25, £15

Judge: Richard Ramsay

##### Class 30

The Tattersalls and RoR Thoroughbred JUMPING Class

Mare or gelding 4yrs old or over and of any height. Riders must be 15 years old or over. Horses to be ridden in any suitable bridle and should be plaited. The first 3 qualify for the final at the SHB of GB Hunter Show at Addington in September 2011. All entries must be registered with Weatherbys in the General Stud Book and with RoR. This class is open to thoroughbreds that HAVE raced only\* There will be a prize for the highest placed veteran 15 years or over. Horses will NOT be ridden by the judge. The class to be judged 40% jumping a mixture of 8 rustic/coloured fences. 20% Style while jumping and performance. 20% awarded for individual show and 20% conformation and suitability to be retrained. ##### Class 31

The Tattersalls and RoR Thoroughbred RIDDEN Class

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4years old or over, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, pelham or simple double bridle. Horses should be plaited. The first two go forward to the championship at the Hickstead Derby Meeting on 2011. Qualification will go down to 4<sup>th</sup> place if the first 2 have already qualified. All entries MUST be registered with Weatherbys in their General Stud Book. and MUST also be registered with the ROR. The class is open to thoroughbreds that have RACED. There will be a prize for the highest placed veteran 15 years or over. The class will be run under the rules of RoR. Horses to be ridden by the judge.
